## **Julius Caesar v Pope Gregory**



In 46 B.C. the Roman emperor Julius Caesar first established January 1 as New Year's day. Janus was the Roman god of doors and gates, and had two faces, one looking forward and one back. Caesar felt that the month named after this god ("January") would be the appropriate "door" to the year. By the early medieval period most of Christian Europe regarded Annunciation Day (March 25) as the beginning of the year. This was when the angel Gabriel's announced to Mary that she would be the mother of Jesus.

After William the Conqueror became King of England on 25<sup>th</sup> December, 1066, he decreed that the English return to the date of January 1. This move ensured that the commemoration of Jesus' birthday would align with William's coronation and the commemoration of Jesus' circumcision (January 1) would start the new year. This was eventually rejected, and England rejoined the rest of the Christian world and returned to celebrating New Years Day on March 25.

In 1582, Pope Gregory XIII abandoned the traditional Julian calendar because it was slightly inaccurate and had slipped by one day per century. This regression had amounted to 14 days, so the seasons and longest and shortest days were off. The Gregorian Calendar was adopted to replace it and New Years Day returned to January 1<sup>st</sup>, with the tax year remaining on March 25<sup>th</sup> until 1900 when it was formalised as April 6<sup>th</sup>.

#### A Letter from the Vicar God with flesh on

The story is told of a little boy away on a church weekend with his dad. Come the evening, the dad put the boy to bed, and told him not to worry, 'Daddy will be downstairs with the grown ups'. The little boy was worried about being on his own in a strange place. Dad reassured him not to worry, because God was with him all the time. The little boy's response was that he knew that, 'But just for tonight I'd like God with flesh on.' Out of the mouths of children... that is exactly the point, and the good news of Christmas. Unlikely as it sounds, at Christmas, we celebrate the remarkable truth that in the baby in the manger, God has come to us with flesh on. As I write, the world feels like a challenging place. We are living through a cost of living crisis which, despite promises of improvement, doesn't feel that way as many people struggle to make ends meet. War continues to rage in Europe between Ukraine and Russia, and a viscous conflict is playing out between Israel and Hammas in Gaza. All this before we add the ever-present concerns of climate change. The world feels less safe than it has done for a long time. If we feel like that little boy, scared of being left alone, we need look no further than the manger, and the baby lying in it. Despite all the uncertainty and insecurity in the world around us, nothing can change the truth that in Jesus, God has come to us with flesh on. He is Emmanuel, God with us, not just for Christmas, but all the time.

**National Harvest** Following the success of the British Food Fortnight National Harvest in 2022, we wanted to build on the success to create an annual Cheshire Harvest Celebration. On 24<sup>th</sup> September, a new red tractor drove through the streets of Chester and pulled up outside Chester Cathedral, where it remained for the afternoon. Throughout that time, an enthusiastic member of the agricultural community talked to passers by about the tractor and the link between food and farming. He also helped children and adults who were game enough, to milk a model cow and have a feel of what it might be like to hand milk a real cow. In the afternoon, the cathedral choir enjoyed looking at the tractor and having photographs taken with their Director of Music in the cab.



Agricultural and countryside groups and organisations had displays in the Cloisters. Cheshire Young Farmers, Reaseheath College and Norton Priory spoke to visitors, cathedral congregations and staff about their work, making contact with people they would never otherwise meet. Cheshire Agricultural Chaplaincy were also represented, and NFU children's activity sheets were handed out to young visitors, and adults who knew children and wanted to take an activity sheet for them. By 3.00 pm, the nave of the cathedral was comfortably full as around 200 people from the food and farming community gathered for the Cheshire Harvest Festival Service. A farmer who has created a successful diary business by layering different parts of the business spoke about how farming and dairy work hand in hand on their farm, and I, Chaplain to the Cheshire Agricultural Society.
